## **EXTERIOR SIDING STYLE CHOICES**







These styles can be done with any exterior color combination you choose.



Board and Batt with 5 rows of lap at the bottom and lap accent in between columns



Full Lap with cedar stain



Board and Batt with 8 rows of lap at the bottom (choose between lap rows on front or whole house)



Board (no Batt) with bump out box bays and tower dormer with lap inside them





Full Vertical Cempanel Board (no Batt) - a.k.a. Standard Sizzler Exterior



Board (no Batt) with 5 rows of lap at the bottom with a third trim color



Board (no Batt) with lap accent between the columns and Z-shutters



**Estate Exterior** (board and batt with 5 rows o lap at the bottom and a trim colors on eaves, above lap and around windows and doors)

Board and Batt with Mahogany Stain



Board and Batt with Cedar Stain

**Executive Exterior** (vertical board with 5 rows of lap at bottom and craftsman style porch with arched gable)



Full Lap with mahogany stain



Vertical Base with 5 Rows of Lap at Bottom (on the front only) and lap accent between columns and two box bays with rock accent



Cempanel Base with stained Lap Accent in Clerestory and Z shutters (brown bag base, mahogany stain and bronze metal roof)







Vinyl Siding (available in clay, white, tan and pearl)

## On all exteriors you have three paint/stain areas:

THE BASE (the main body color)

**THE ACCENT** (sometimes an insert between the columns or in a clerestory, sometimes the rows of lap at the bottom) - you have to specify what you want to accent.

**THE TRIM** (the eaves, the trim around the windows and doors, and the trim board above the lap accent, if applicable) - you have to specify what you want to be trimmed in the trim color.

## If you have a porch, then you have to choose:

THE TYPE OF PORCH GABLE (open, closed, or crows foot) - Picture #19 shows the basic porch gable.

Picture #10 has a crows foot gable. Picture #11 has a closed gable. Picture #5 has an open gable. Picture #18 has a closed gable with crows foot accent.

THE STYLE OF COLUMNS (standard, craftsman, etc)

Pictures #5, #10 and #11 are standard columns. Pictures #13 and #14 are craftsman style columns.

**THE PORCH OPENING(S)** - you have to mark the location of the openings

THE TYPE OF MATERIAL USED ON THE PORCH RAILING (white vinyl, stained plywood, painted plywood, etc)
